Instructions –

Since all good standing members of the American Legion may be considered for the Legionnaire of the Year nominee, it is our belief each Post in our Department should participate in this recognition program.

FORM MUST BE TYPED OR PRINTED!!!

The nomination form must have three or more signatures.

Your nominee should be selected upon their overall record as a Legionnaire, and his/her contributions to community service and our country. The period is from May 1st through April 30th, of the current year. The paragraph nominating an outstanding member should be precise, and written in such a manner that it identifies their contributions to their Post, District and Department, but in no way disclose the person. Additional pages may be attached to the resume side of the application if required not to exceed 500 words.

The Legionnaires' name and member identification number should appear only upon the form submitted to the Department Adjutant.

Upon receipt of the nomination packets, the Department Adjutant will assign a tracking number to each packet and send the Statement page with the tracking packet number to the Department Americanism Committee Chairman. The Committee chair shall call a meeting of the committee to review the application Statements and they shall select a Department of New Hampshire Legionnaire of the Year from these. The Chairman shall notify the Department Adjutant the tracking number on the Statement page selected. The Department Adjutant will match the selected Statement tracking number to the application that was mailed to the Adjutants Office by the Nominator. The Department Adjutant will then announce at the Department Convention the name of the Department Legionnaire of the Year.

A COPY OF THE DEPARTMENT WINNER WILL BE FORWARDED TO NATIONAL FOR CONSIDERATION FOR NATIONAL LEGIONNAIRE OF THE YEAR AWARD.
